

Covid-19 ICU Remote-Learning Course (CIRLC)

Description

This series of six lectures was originally developed by Brunel University, 33N and the CLEAR team as part of a one-day course to support medical and nursing staff redeployed to Critical Care as part of the NHS response to the COVID-19 pandemic.

The course usually combines lectures with on-line group tutorials facilitated by a tutor during which participants can ask questions etc. These tutorials are referred to in the lectures.

The on-line only version of this course on the e-LfH Hub does **NOT** include the tutorials.

The six lectures will introduce non-critical care staff to the principles of basic ICU care, the equipment and drugs that are commonly used as well as the ventilation strategies for patients with Acute Respiratory Distress Syndrome due to COVID-19.
